

In order to truly celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus at Easter, we have to first observe the Crucifixion. The Crucifixion and the Resurrection are two parts of a story that go together. That's why the gospel writers tell us about the days leading up to Jesus' death on the Cross, before they tell us about his Resurrection. The writer of John's gospel relates an important story of how Jesus gave his disciples a new commandment to love one another, just as he had loved them. This commandment of Jesus to his disciples is also his commandment to us. When we respond to God's love for us in Jesus Christ, we are then able to love one another with a godly love that can only come from the Holy Spirit.

I hope you will make time to attend our April 17th Maundy Thursday service at Culdee Church. The service will be at 7:00 p.m., and we'll share Communion with one another as we remember the days leading up to the Crucifixion of Jesus. Then on Easter Sunday on April 20th, we'll joyfully celebrate together the Resurrection of our Savior!

Culdee is collecting the following two items for Church World Service HYGIENE KITS.


- Travel-size deodorant 3.4 oz. or less (non-aerosol)

FINANCE MINISTRY




He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Matthew 28:6
