

Finance Ministry

2022 Budget Process:

After consulting the attached October 2021 financial statement from Sandhills Accounting Services, the Finance Ministry maintains its 2022 budget recommendations to the Session. Since current contributions are not fully funding the 2021 budget, the Finance Ministry's 2022 proposal, based on actual 2021 Ministry expenses, suggested lowering amounts where feasible. Compensating an installed pastor remains a priority.

The positive news is that Culdee's expenses are way under the 2021 Budget for most Ministries and contributions are surpassing current expenses. Thank you for your continued support of God's work at Culdee.

Reported to the Finance Ministry members was that the Session began deliberating the 2022 Budget at the October Session meeting, increasing some amounts proposed by the Finance Ministry. The 2022 Budget was not approved as the employee section was still to be discussed. Elders Eve Williamson, Tim Bailey and Robert Barber requested Finance gather and present comparative salary data for music directors before determining any changes to employee compensation. Elders Patti Burke, Danny Aldridge and Diann Fortune gathered the requested data which showed that for churches similar in size to Culdee with one music person on staff, music staff worked between 10-15 hours per week at an average annual salary of \$17,050.00.

The discussion of the 2022 Budget will continue at the November Session meeting after presentation of the requested salary data. Once the Session determines and approves the 2022 Budget, the new information will be turned over to Sandhills Accounting Services so they are prepared for any changes prior to January 2022.

Financial Status:


Operations: Thank you for your support of Culdee. Culdee has been blessed to operate during the pandemic without being forced to cut hours or staff. October's expenses remain under the 2021 year-to-date budget.

Investments: Investments are funds that may or may not be replaced once used up. The investments' earnings chart shows the wisdom of the Session in approving the recommendations from the Finance Ministry/ Investments Committee to move funds under the professional oversight of Stifel. The growth of these funds will help Culdee honor God with gifts given to His glory. Although the market will fluctuate, with Stifel's guidance, losses will be minimal and earnings should still be greater than what is observed with the banks.
