

year!



Chancel Choir For the Colony




The Chancel Choir is filling a need in the community with their "Choir For

























Finance Ministry: Chairman Danny Aldridge & Vice Chair Diann Fortune

Welcome:

The Finance Ministry welcomed Pastor Connie Weaver who attended its June meeting. Introductions were made and general information was shared both personally and collectively about Culdee Presbyterian.

Financial Status:

The Financial Report from Sandhills Accounting Services for May 2022 showed Year-to-Date contributions were \$1,135.79 under budget needs but expenses were also under budget by \$23,660.38. Culdee teeters monthly with contributions meeting budget and not meeting budget. With the addition of an installed pastor to the church family, expenses will naturally increase. It was noted that weekly attendance has increased with her arrival and hopefully contributions will begin to consistently meet the budget. It has been necessary to utilize some reserve funds, which Pastor Connie referred to as a form of protection for the church, to cover some recent repairs and expenses. Hopefully that will not be have to be a regular reoccurrence.

Also discussed were the interest rates between Truist Bank and Live Oak Bank CDs. Live Oak Bank is paying higher interest at the moment so there remains consideration to using Live Oak for Culdee's CDs.

Additional Tidbits:

Jewell Vest retired from Culdee's staff at the end of June. Leo Williams has been hired and will likely be around the last week of June. Please welcome him with gratitude and be patient as he settles into a routine.

Due to many tragic occurrences nationally, Pastor Connie inquired as to whether Culdee has utilized background checks for employees and anyone working with Culdee's children and youth. She had to sign a covenant with the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina that she would do all she could to protect the Culdee family.


The appraisal of the Baldwin Baby Grand piano from *K. Stuart Fulghum and the Team* was presented for insurance purposes. Its insurance value is \$19,080.00 and Farm Bureau has this documentation.


Of great concern is the need to replenish both the Missions and Building and Grounds accounts. Quarterly payments for supported Missions are made with funds coming mainly from the love shown Culdee through the Fall Harvest Festival. As most know, the Fall Harvest Festival began so that members did not have to be asked for additional contributions each time there was an expensive repair or replacement at the church or manse. The pandemic caused the Harvest Festival's postponement for the last two years and both accounts are depleted.
